Names are powerful and self-defining. My first name is Richard, it means brave and strong of heart. I hope I am those things. When we look at the names of scripture we begin to see that names are more than just something to call one another. Abraham means father of many, Isaac means, he will laugh, and who wouldn’t laugh at a 92 year old sara having a baby. Jacob means supplanter and Esau means hairy. Even God seems to play this name game. Adam and Eve literally translate to man and woman.

### WORKSHOP ON IMPLICIT BIAS

Presented by Office of the General Assembly Colleagues Jihyun Oh, Director of Mid-Council Ministries and Molly Casteel, Manager of Equity and Representation

Friday, March 13, 2020 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM at First Presbyterian Church of Oneida.

This is a workshop intended for committee chairs, session nominating committees, pastor nominating committees and all who are interested in understanding how cultural bias affects our work as the Church.

F-1.0403 states our commitment as a denomination to "guarantee full participation and representation in its worship, governance, and emerging life to all persons or groups within its membership" at all levels of our life together. This sort of kin-dom where all can fully participate and be represented is foundational to the way we witness to God's sovereign activity in the world and become communities of faith, hope, love, and witness in order to be and become who God continues to call us to be as church, especially as it increases in diversity, examining our biases, growing in cultural proficiency, and enacting equity practices are crucial.

In this 1-day training, we will first learn and discuss concepts to help build frameworks and mental maps that enable us to engage in equity and cultural proficiency work, then we will apply key learnings to our own contexts. Finally, we will reflect on how both the concepts and the application might help to build Christ's kin-dom in our communities.
