Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit in the wilderness, where for forty days he was tempted by the devil. He ate nothing at all during those days, and when they were over, he was famished.

The earliest mention of Lent in the history of the Church comes from the council of Nicaea in 325 AD. The council of Nicaea is best known for the profession of faith, the 'Nicene Creed', which is still recited in many churches every Sunday immediately after the sermon. However, the council also issued twenty canons of a practical nature, dealing with various aspects of church life, and the fifth of these canons speaks of Lent.

The word used for Lent in this fifth canon is tessarakonta (Greek), which means forty. For the first time in history, we are told this period of preparation for Easter lasts for forty days. The English word Lent has another definition. It comes from the Anglo-Saxon (early English) word meaning to lengthen. Lent comes at a time when the hours of daytime are lengthening, as spring approaches, and it is a time when we too can lengthen spiritually, when we can stretch out and grow in the Spirit.

Just as people thought it was the sun that made the days longer during early Spring time, so it is the Son that does this work in our lengthening and growing. This image provides comfort to us who live in this busy world today, where activity and busyness can become the way we live our lives. Our task during Lent is to cooperate with God's grace and movement in our lives, in a sense to relax in the presence of God, rather than to force the pace with our own efforts.

This doesn't mean to sit back and relax but instead to open our eyes to see what it is God is doing around us, what God is saying to us, and how God may be challenging us. Lent is a time to simplify our lives so that God can recharge us to go out into the world with mission and purpose. I hope all of you will take the devotional we have chosen and make it a part of your day, every day, during lent. If you can't get one in the sanctuary let us know and we will mail one to you. Let's all let the warmth of God's love help us to grow this Lenten season.
