Live into Hope: The Theme for the 226th General Assembly

That's nice, you might be thinking, to choose a hymn title as the theme for a General Assembly. The hymn is based on Luke 4:16-19, Jesus' sermon in Nazareth. But what is a General Assembly and how does it matter? Maybe another question is what do we believe about what church is. The Book of Order cites the Nicene Creed as it reminds Presbyterians that "with all Christians of the Church catholic, we affirm that the Church is "one holy catholic and apostolic." That is, we affirm our "historical continuity with the whole Church of Jesus Christ, just as we are "willing to seek and to deepen communion with all other churches within the one holy catholic and apostolic Church."

Yet, we also observe some historic principles of church order. These are built upon discernment of God's will through the Holy Spirit and Scripture. Consider Acts 15 relating what may have been the first council with apostles and elders meeting in Jerusalem; it's a question of accepting Gentiles into the church. The PCUSA is still governed by presbyters – ruling elders and teaching elders (more familiarly known as ministers of Word and Sacrament). We gather in councils – session (which "leads and guides the witness of the congregation"), presbytery, synod, and General Assembly. Trusting in Jesus Christ, who is Lord of all creation, we "seek a new openness to God's mission in the world" and "to people everywhere and to all creation."

General Assembly is the council of the whole church "to the end that the whole church becomes a community of faith, hope, love, and witness." GA meets every two years and is comprised of equal numbers of ruling and teaching elders elected by each presbytery and reflective of our diversity. Ruling elder Michelle Nolan from Rome and I were chosen to serve as commissioners from Utica Presbytery.

The committees to which we are assigned will meet virtually to help control costs. The plenary sessions run from June 29 to July 4 in Salt Lake City. Please hold us, and indeed, the Assembly, the whole church, and the whole world in prayer that we may listen to and for the Holy Spirit and truly "live into hope" for all God's children have got a place in the choir.

Farmers Market Coupons



Coupons can be used to purchase locally grown fruits and vegetables at any participating Farmer's Market. **YOU QUALIFY IF** you are at least 60 years of age **AND** have a monthly income at or below: \$2,322 for a one-person household, \$3,152 for a two-person household, \$3,981 for a three-person household, or are at least 60 years of age and currently receiving or eligible to receive SSI, food stamps, public assistance, or Section 8 housing subsidy.

Each eligible older adult living in a household may receive their own booklet, but they must be present to sign for them. If an older adult is unable to pick up the coupons in person, contact the OFA at 315-867-1204. Coupons will be distributed at the following centers on a first come, first served basis.
