Garden Green Update

Paul Conant has been selected to be the chairman of the green team. George Gullis and Paul went over plans for the gardening strategy to grow crops for our use to help offset costs of the free diners that are offered each 2nd and 4th Thursday of the month. We will be building a garden structure that will facilitate 12 pots used for growing peppers and will have vegetables growing in pots around the church procured by Marvin. A section of land behind and to the side of Steve Getman's garage has been offered for growing a number of different vegetables. To help facilitate the expenditure for seeds, plants, building materials and other gardening needs we, with the help of Steve Getman, Karen Macrina and her Garden Club, have initiated a proposal for a grant that if successful will help greatly with what we need to succeed with this endeavor. More information will be posted as the process gets under way.

Building and Grounds

The Buildings and Grounds committee members are, Don Lamphear, Marvin Nellenback, Robert Kennedy and George Gullis.

We are always looking for new members to help out. If you are interested in and would like to be on this committee, please talk to any one of the members. We generally meet the second Tuesday of every month at 2:00 p m at church.

Currently we are reviewing bids to upgrade our fire alarm system. We have three bids and will sort thru the details to see what's best for us. Also, we are reviewing a contract from another company to maintain and repair our Vertical Platform Lift. The company we have been doing business with is not responding to our needs in a way that is acceptable to us and to the company that inspects our VPL twice per year.

The hardwood flooring in the Fellowship Hall is showing signs of wear. The company that refinished the floor will make a recommendation as to what could / should be done to restore the beauty of the floor.

A local flooring contractor has inspected the vinyl flooring that has raised up in the downstairs rooms. There seems to be a moisture problem which is impeding the adhesion of the glue. This will be worked on in June when the weather is warmer. This contractor will also repair the loose carpeting in the Sanctuary.

The flagpole has been repaired, and a new flag was installed. These are just a few of the items we are working on.




