Our Abolitionist Roots

Whitesboro's Radical Vision: The Oneida Institute, Abolition, and Black Student Admission

The Oneida Institute of Science and Industry in Whitesboro, an academy nationally known for its radical, "immediatist" abolitionism under its leader Rev. Beriah Green, was founded with financial support from the Oneida Presbytery. It was the first higher educational academy in the nation to admit Black students. The Institute was closely connected to the First Presbyterian Church of Whitesboro where Green often preached. Rev. John Frost, pastor of the Whitesboro church, was an ally of Green and deeply committed to abolition.

A Fitness Minute (by Susan Backus, M.S.)

New study suggests coffee could add years to your life. (This makes me very happy...) Not only does it "get things moving in the morning (buh-bye constipation) but it has been linked to a reduced risk of heart disease and Alzheimer's disease, and it may help your thyroid work better. After looking at all the evidence, researchers concluded regular coffee drinkers may enjoy an extra 2 years of life; and it's more years with good health. What good is a longer life if you don't also have a good quality of life???

Another study found a very surprising factor that could increase your dementia risk by 31% (and you won't believe what it is.) About 1 in 10 Americans over 65 have dementia, and it's estimated to grow to 88 million by 2050. (Most of us don't have to worry about the year 2050.) There are things that we can do now to keep our brain sharp; eat healthy, exercise, and get enough sleep. The thing researchers found to increase you risk of dementia by 31% is.....LONELINESS. If you are feeling lonely there are things you can do to help yourself: reach out to family and friends, join a group (Class Act, perhaps), volunteer, and engage in healthy habits to name a few. If you know someone who is lonely, reach out to them regularly. It can be a text to say 'hi', or a quick phone call. It may just be the motivation they need to do more for themselves. - Beef & Broccoli, 22 oz. for \$6.00: The beef and broccoli consists of beef strips, broccoli florets, and red bell peppers with white rice in a savory soy sauce.
- Chicken Wings, 5 lbs. for \$9.00: The chicken wings are ready for the air-fryer or grill and are individually quickly frozen.
- French Fries, 5 lbs. for \$5.00: The French Fries are ready to cook and can be used in the oven or airfryer.
- Breaded Shrimp, 3 lbs. for \$13.00: The shrimp are butterflied, breaded, and 21-25 per pound.
